Taking Our Literacy Show on the Road

There are often times when you **cannot** see Youth Services staff members conducting literacy programs because they are out and about, taking programs to children in schools, day care centers and even senior residences.

Youth Services outreach efforts for young children include monthly intergenerational programs at Oak Park Place. **Babygarten** is for children from birth to age 18 months and their parents and caregivers. Anne Horjus, Youth Services program coordinator, and Gail Johnson, Youth Services program assistant, lead participants in rhymes, music, and stories, while emphasizing the importance of reading to babies.

Seniors who reside at Oak Park Place often gather and join in the fun.

Booker's Buddies caters to Children ages 3-5 and their parents and caregivers, along with seniors who get a kick out of interacting with kids as they enjoy stories, songs, and crafts.

Anne Horjus uses his skills in arts, crafts, teaching and performance during monthly **CrafterNoon** sessions at St. Clare Meadows. Children in kindergarten through 3rd grade can attend these programs with their parents and caregivers, along with interested residents at the facility.

Carey Kipp, Youth Services librarian, says that these intergenerational programs give kids a chance to interact with older adults, which many of the kids might not have in their lives on a regular basis. The visits also bring youthful energy into the lives of seniors who live at these residences.

Youth Services staff members also bring early literacy activities to local 4K, kindergarten and first grade classrooms. Anne makes monthly visits to 4K classes at St. Joseph's, St. John's, New Life Childcare, and St. Clare Tommy Bartlett Child Care

Center for story times. Gail travels to Children's Day Center, Bear-a-boo Daycare, West Kindergarten Center, and East Elementary School each month to share stories with 4K students.

Carey Kipp, makes monthly school visits to read to early childhood, kindergarten and first grade classrooms at East, Al Behrman, Gordon L. Willson, and West Schools. She also makes monthly visits to Children's Day Center, St. Joseph's, St. Clare, and St. John's 4K classrooms. This summer, in addition to making weekly visits to Kidstop students at Gordon L. Willson, and to summer school students at Al Behrman, she will make weekly visits to the Boys and Girls Club of West-Central Wisconsin in Baraboo, to lead kids in summer reading program activities.


Efforts to encourage reading activities by Baraboo area youth also include older students. Penny Johnson, teen specialist, visits English classes at Baraboo High School to register students for library cards in advance of a Junior class research project. She visits each Jack Young Middle School Language Arts class in the spring to tell students about the library's summer reading program for teens. She also provides book talks and other activities to classes throughout the school year. This summer, during June and July, Penny will make weekly visits to Baraboo School District summer school Language Arts classes to do book talks and bring books for teens to check out.
