When you finish reading the book, please share it with a friend, or return it to the library so others may read it.

The April 9 book discussion at the Baraboo Public Library is one of the community events for people of all ages planned for April by an alliance of professionals involved in fostering education and reading in the Baraboo area. Baraboo Reads is focused on books with themes of unity, equity, and inclusivity.

Partners in planning the Baraboo Reads project are the Baraboo Public Library, the Baraboo School District, and UW-Platteville Baraboo Sauk County. The project is part of the Community Action Plan that has so far included Baraboo Gathers, Baraboo Talks, and Baraboo Acts. The action plan was formed in response to the controversial photo that gained media attention in November 2018.


Lit Wits Book Group Tuesday, Mar. 12 at 6:30 PM

Tuesdays with Murder Book Group Tuesday, Mar. 19 at 6:30 PM


